NEW - AGL Warmth in Winter energy assistance grants

AGL is please to announce that Warmth in Winter 2011 applications will be opening on Monday 16th May 2011. Through this program, AGL seeks to support community organisations that address the important and challenging social issue of homelessness. They do this by assisting homeless services to be more energy efficient through two streams:

- Funding a proportion of the winter gas and /or electricity bills for overnight emergency or crisis accommodation services in order to free up cash to redirect to other essential services.
- Assisting a number of these crisis accommodation services to make ongoing reductions to their energy consumption by funding energy audits and implementing energy efficient measure in these organisations' premises

NEW – Central Coast Community College

Central Coast Community College have ongoing courses for adults with a disability who live in the Gosford or Wyong Shire and who have an unpaid carer. Unpaid carers include people who receive a carers allowance, who work or receive the pension. These courses continue throughout the year, so people wishing to participate can start anytime. The courses are aimed at providing respite and social recreation and are governed by what the participant would like to accomplish in the course.

NEW – Better Start funding

From 1st July 2011 families of eligible children diagnosed with Down Syndrome, Cerebral Palsy, Fragile X syndrome, or a moderate or greater vision or hearing impairment, including deaf blindness, will have access to early intervention funding and new Medicare items under the Australian Government's *Better Start for Children with Disability* initiative.

Eligible children will be able to be registered to access early intervention funding of up to \$12,000 (to a maximum of \$6,000 per financial year). The funding will be able to be used to pay for early intervention services including speech pathology, audiology, occupational therapy, physiotherapy, psychology and orthoptics.

In NSW, Carers NSW will deliver a dedicated Better Start Registration and Information Service, to provide the eligible families and carers with information about eligibility entitlement to supports and services in their local area.

NEW – National Disability Insurance Scheme

The NSW Government is proposing a pilot program for the National Disability Insurance Scheme in the Hunter. The Hunter is the most appropriate trial region for the NDIS, due to its population size and mix of rural and metropolitan settings; and the existence of a current single access point for community care. The final report of the Productivity commission's Inquiry into Disability Care and Support will be presented to the Federal Government on the 31 July 2011.

Keep Them Safe

The Keep Them Safe principles in action were proposed by Justice James Wood. Below presents the third principle, and identifies some of the actions being taken that align with the principle.

Principle

- The child protection system should be child focused, with the safety, welfare and wellbeing of the child or young person being of paramount concern, while recognizing that supporting parents is usually in the best interests of the child or young person.
- [note: the first half of this statement remains the “paramount principle” of the Children and Young persons (Care and protection) Act.]

Actions that support this principle

- Implementation of Whole of Family Teams, located within health, responding to parent alcohol and other drug, and mental health issues that are impacting on the safety and well being of children
- Support services for families whose children are at risk of coming into care, through the Early Intervention and Placement prevention Program (previously CSGP funding through Community Services).
- Engaging with families where children are in care, and restoration has been identified as a possibility.
- Changes in Children’s Court proceedings to increase consistency in practice standards and reduce the oppositional nature of proceedings. Included in this is extension of Alternative Dispute Resolution options.
- Increasing collaboration between agencies such as Community Services and Ageing Disability and home Care

In a shock last minute submission to Fair Work Australia (FWA) the NSW government has said that there is no case for equal pay and no case for a wage increase for SACS workers.

The government filed a submission and made the following points:

Pay Increase

No case has been made that would justify the granting on equal pay order

Funding

If the increases the ASU seeks are granted then the government will want productivity trade offs

The law

The government submission attempts to overturn the recent advances in the law in relation to equal pay, insisting that women must show that they are discriminated against before they are entitled to an equal pay order

You work

Your work is not similar or the same as the work done in the public sector

A Rally will be held in Hyde Park and march on to Parliament House.
